**Subject:- Grant of Conditional permission to Bhargava Ayurveda College, Vidyagram, Post-Dahemi, Ta. Borsad, Distt. Anand-388560, Gujarat (Inst ID: AYU00441) for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24 and issuance of Letter of Permission for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) Course from 60 seats to 100 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2023-24-regarding.**

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. I am to refer to your application vide ref. no. **SHTC SECT/370/2022 dated 28.10.2022**, on the subject cited above and to verify the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff and other facilities available at your college namely **Bhargava Ayurveda College, Vidyagram, Post-Dahemi, Ta. Borsad, Distt. Anand-388560, Gujarat (Inst. ID: AYU00441) for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats from the academic session 2023-24**, visitation has been carried out for issuance of Letter of Intent (LoI) on **20.04.2023 & 21.04.2023 through hybrid mode** by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board (NCISM) and Letter of Intent (LoI) has been issued to your college vide letter of **even no. dated 22.05.2023 for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 from the academic session 2023-24.**
2. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) had carried out an inspection of the college again on **10.08.2023 and 11.08.2023 through Hybrid mode** to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities available as a part of annual visitation **for issuance of conditional permission for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24 and issuance of Letter of Permission for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 from the academic session 2023-24.**
3. Further, in view of above assessment report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely "the Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020.
4. Further, two faculties of your institution in the academic year 2022-23 were proven to be physically absent but working only on paper teacher and in accordance with section 28(1)(f) of NCISM Act 2020, regulation 3(1)(f) of RMS, 2016 as per the letter of MARBISM vide letter no 26-75/2021-visitation dated 31/8/2021 and letter no. 3/2022/MARB/General Matter dated 17/8/22, **a penalty of rupees 50 lakh** was imposed on your institution as **two faculties namely Dr. Upendra Kapilray Dave (AYXX00151) and Dr. Bhargavi Parmar (AYXX00534)** were proven to be physically not present but working only on paper teachers and same was communicated to you vide letter no. Teacher Verification/MARB/2022 dated 17.03.2023 and **reminder letter was sent to you vide letter dated 17.08.2023.**
5. In response of the same you have furnished the imposed penalty amount **worth Rupees 50 lakh** in favour of The National Commission fund for Indian System of Medicine through RTGS vide **UTR No. BARBR52023082200926996 dated 22.08.2023 from Bank of Baroda, Gujarat and informed the same vide an email dated 23.08.2023 enclosing a letter vide ref. no. BAC/362/2023 dated 23.08.2023.**



6. As per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the assessment report was placed in the **55<sup>th</sup> Board Meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **25.08.2023**. Board decided that the college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for **Grant of conditional Permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and issuance of letter of Permission for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) Course from 60 seats to 100 seats under section 29 of NCISM ACT 2020 from academic session 2023-24.**
7. Further, in accordance of the regulation 6 (3) (j) (ii) of "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019 vide letter of even no. **dated 01.09.2023** a letter was sent to you to submit fixed security deposit worth **Rupees 50 lakhs for a period of five years** in favor of National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine, in response of the same you have submitted the fixed security deposit in view of issuance of letter of permission in favor of the National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine of **rupees 50 lakhs through RTGS ref. No.- HDFCR52023090585337343 dated 05.09.2023, transferred by HDFC Bank (for a period of five years) and informed the same vide an email dated 05.09.2023 enclosing a letter vide ref. no. BAC/392/2023 dated 05.09.2023.**
8. **Therefore, Grant of Conditional Permission is issued to Bhargava Ayurveda College, Vidyagram, Post-Dahemi, Ta. Borsad, Distt. Anand-388560, Gujarat (Inst. ID: AYU00441) for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24 and issuance of Letter of Permission (LOP) for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats from the academic session 2023-24 under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, subject to following conditions:**
  - I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
  - II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the **permitted intake capacity of 100 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
  - III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
9. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
10. **Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or subsequent year.**
11. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
12. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2024-25:-**
  - i) all the requirements of the enforced regulations namely "the Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019
  - ii) all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - iii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
  - iv) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto; and
13. This permission **for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats from the academic session 2023-24** as stated above for the first admitted batch of 2023-24 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these courses appear for the first final examination of the said courses and at that time, the College authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 35 of the NCISM Act 2020.

14. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
